## Knights Swept By Northland in Double Header

### **GAME 1**

Northland College 9, MLC 6

NEW ULM, Minn. – The MLC baseball team lost game one of a Thursday double header against Northland College 9-6 at Mueller Park.

The Knights had a 4-2 lead heading into the top of the fifth inning, but allowed three runs in the fifth and four more in the sixth on the way to the loss.

MLC outlit the Lumberjacks 13-10 for the game, but Northland took advantage of three errors by the MLC defense and seven walks by the Knights' pitching staff.

Josh Janke got the start for the Knights, pitching five-plus innings and allowing all nine runs (six earned) as he fell to 1-2 on the season.

At the plate, Greg Holzhueter led the way with four hits and three RBI in five at bats, while Joe Janke added three hits. Tyler Morgan and Josh Schultz each added one RBI in the loss.

### **GAME 2**

Northland College 13, MLC 6

NEW ULM, Minn. – Northland College busted a 2-2 game open with a six-run second inning on the way to winning game two 13-6.

The Knights chipped away at the lead, scoring two runs in the third inning and one run in the fourth and fifth innings, but Northland did enough to keep MLC at bay, scoring insurance runs in the third, fourth, sixth and seventh innings.

Justin Hansen got the start for the Knights and fell to 0-3 on the season with the loss. He went all six and two-thirds of an inning, allowing 13 runs (six earned) on 11 hits, nine walks and five hit batters.

The Knights hitters were led by Stephen Apt, who had three hits and scored two runs. Holzhueter and Pudlo both added two hits, with Pudlo driving in a team-best two runs.

With the losses, the Knights fell to 3-14 on the season and 3-4 in UMAC play, while Northland improved to 4-11 overall and 2-5 in conference action.
